

#### Breakout #1: Troponin, Evolution and the New Generation

Theresa Joseph, RN, BSN, Medical Scientific Liaison-Cardiac, Medical and Scientific Affairs, Roche Diagnostics and Sponsor

Breakout #11: Managing Laboratory Test Utilization: Relationship to Total Cost of Care

Over the last 5-7 years, the focus on managing test utilization has been on reducing the number of tests performed assuming that the overuse is unnecessary. There is also a need to understand when increasing utilization or performing more testing will actually reduce the overall patient "total cost of care" (TCOC). HealthPartners' TCOC framework addresses one of the most fundamental problems related to population health: rising healthcare costs.

On any given day, about one in 20 hospital patients has at least one healthcareassociated infection (HAIs). Approximately 1.7 million HAIs occur in U.S. hospitals each year, resulting in 99,000 deaths and an estimated \$20 billion in healthcare costs. This presentation will summarize the risk factors associated with the HAI MRSA and its prevalence in multiple research settings.
